Bold, italicized type is an invitation to the congregation to read aloud.



*Call to Worship

Here in this place, we can ask big questions. Who is my neighbor? How can I help? What do I have to learn? Where is God in it all? Here in this place, we can ask big questions. So may we listen. May we learn. May we stay curious, and may we look for God.

Throughout Lent we will pray a prayer of invocation early in worship. This prayer calls to mind God's presence in everything. This prayer is an offering from Sanctified Art.

This is our invitation to lean in. Let us worship our holy God.

*A Prayer of Invocation

God meets us in the night before the sun rises, before the wound heals, before there are answers, before there is closure. God meets us in the light where joy is effervescent, where laughter is contagious, where flowers bloom from cracks in the sidewalk, where people gather around tables. God meets us in between at the edge of the water, at the beginning of the wilderness, at the start of something new, on the edge of faith. And if God meets us in all those places, then surely God meets us everywhere at the water's edge, at the start of something new, after the baptism, and before the call. We are not alone. God is all around. Let us worship the God of everything.

Call to Confession

Prayer of Confession

Holy God, you have told us to love our neighbors as ourselves, but we get tripped up on logistics.

We want to know: who is our neighbor?
Do we have to love the stranger?
Must we have compassion for our enemy?
Forgive our human tendency to create exceptions in the face of love. Rewire our hearts so that we might see the face of a neighbor in every stranger we pass. With hope we pray, amen.

It's that time of year again, when we join our community to support the SW Hope, 'From Hunger To Hope' campaign. Food insecurity is an even greater issue this time of year when donations and interest dip after the holidays. It is also anticipated that there will be increases in the cost of food that will bring a new wave of need in our community and all around.

SW Hope is much more than a food drive - it is our community's resounding commitment to help neighbors forced to go without. SW Hope aims to raise \$80,000, which will provide a 3-month supply of meals to help neighbors with this most basic of human necessities: food.

Thoughts from Pastor Sarah (Written March 6th)

Dear Kindred in Christ,

Welcome to Lent. I'm grateful for the gathering we had in our chapel last night and for the resources we've gathered from A Sanctified Art. The focal image and poem below are two of those resources, as are the devotional books and cards we made available on Sunday and last night. Today's devotional card reflection prompt is "What keeps you from taking action?" Last night we reflected on Luke 9:51-62, which includes the story of various responses of Jesus' call to discipleship- including several hesitations and delays. Many of us put off until tomorrow what could be done today and delay on giving our hearts and lives fully to the call of God in Christ. Lent is a season for going deeper, committing more fully. How will you take action to go deeper, commit more fully in the next six weeks?
