

The Constitutional Questions

Pastor: Do you sincerely receive and adopt the essential tenets of the Reformed faith as expressed in the confessions of our church as authentic and reliable expositions of what Scripture leads us to believe and do, and will you be instructed and led by those confessions as you lead the people of God?

Candidate: I do and I will.

Pastor: Will you fulfill your office in obedience to Jesus Christ Under the authority of Scripture, and be continually guided by our confessions?

Candidate: I will.

Pastor: Will you endorse our church's polity, and will you abide by its discipline? Will you be a friend among your colleagues in ministry, working with them, subject to the ordering of God's Word and Spirit?

Candidate: I do and I will.

Pastor: Will you in your own life seek to follow the Lord Jesus Christ, love your neighbors, and work for the reconciliation of the world?

Candidate: I will.

Pastor: Do you promise to further the peace, unity, and purity of the Church?

Elder: Do we, the members of this church, accept these persons as elders and deacons, chosen by God through the voice of this congregation, to lead us in the way of Jesus Christ?

Elder: Do we agree to encourage them, to respect their decisions, and to follow as they guide us, serving Jesus Christ, who alone is Head of the Church?

Congregation: We do.

	prophets and apostles who spoke your bold words of
	mercy and of truth. We thank you for disciples in every
	age who have nurtured your people in faith and
	faithfulness. Above all we praise you for Jesus Christ, who
	came not to be served, but to serve, and to give his life to
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set others free. Anointed by your Holy Spirit, he proclaimed your reign on earth, revealing your saving love in all he said and did.

Congregation: Gracious God, pour out your Holy Spirit upon your servants home you called through baptism as your own and marked as your own. Grant them the same mind that was in Christ Jesus. Give them a spirit of truthfulness that they may show the compassion of Christ in the actions of daily living and rightly govern your people. Give them the gifts of your Holy Spirit to build up the church, to strengthen the common life of your people, and to lead with compassion and vision. In the walk of faith and for the work of ministry, give to your servants gladness and strength, discipline and hope, humility, humor, and courage, and an abiding sense of your presence. Elder: Gracious God, pour out your Spirit of power and truth upon the whole church that we may be for you a holy people, baptized to serve you in the world. Sustain this congregation in ministry. Ground us in the gospel, secure our hope in Christ, strengthen our service to the outcast, and increase our love for one another. Show us the transforming power of your grace in our life together, that we may be servants of the gospel, offering a compelling witness in the world to the good news of Christ Jesus our Lord. All: Amen.
